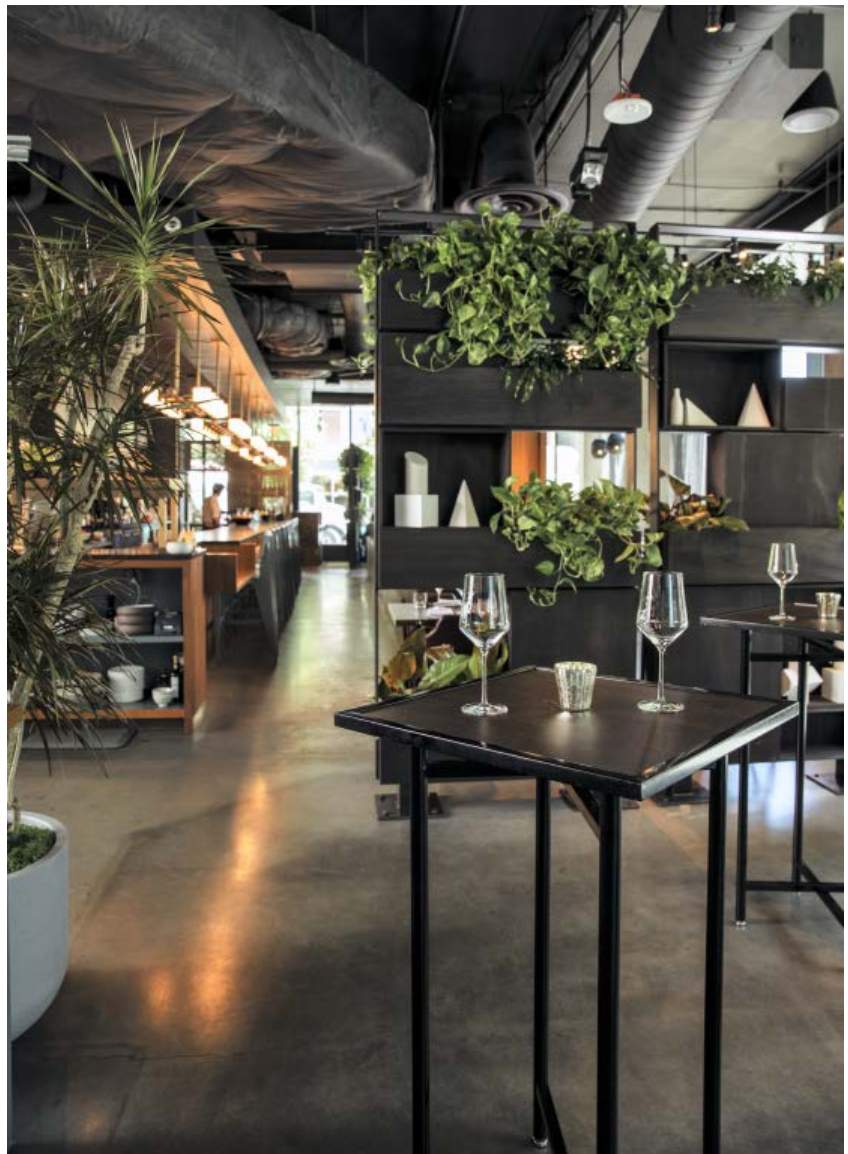

BLACKBIRD



With its “most efficient” cruising speed of more than three times the speed of sound flying at over 85,000 feet, the now-retired Blackbird reconnaissance plane is still the fastest and highest flying air-breathing production aircraft ever built.

DREAMLINER



The distinctive swept wingtips set Boeing's most fuel-efficient airliner apart from the pack. The first major commercial airplane designed with a composite fuselage and wings, the Dreamliner features digital fly-by-wire technology and quiet, environmentally progressive operation.

GRASSHOPPER



These small, lightweight observation and liaison planes were manufactured and put into service quickly to aid the allied effort in World War II. Major General Innis Swift coined the Grasshopper nickname when he remarked to a pilot, "You looked like a damned grasshopper when you landed in those boondocks!"

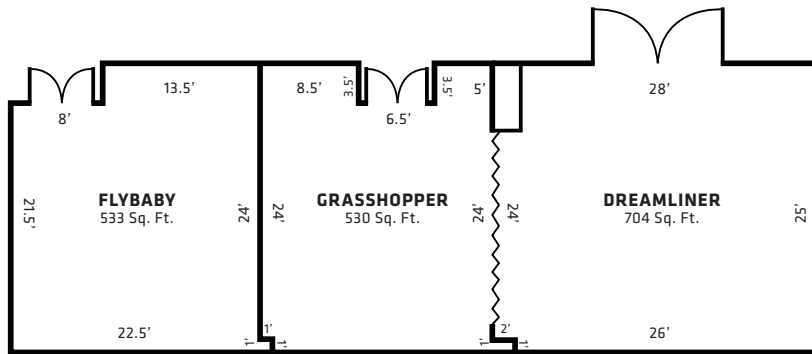
FLYBABY



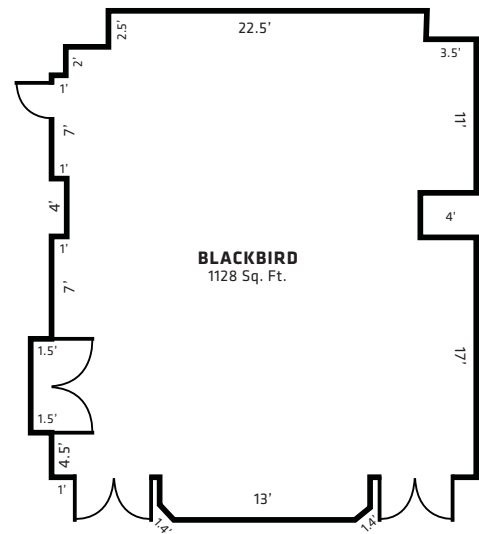
In 1962, the Experimental Aircraft Association put out a call for a low-cost, folding-wing plane that could be easily built, flown and towed or trailered between flights. The Flybaby was the winning entry, designed by lifelong aviation enthusiast and Seattle resident Peter Bowers, who enjoyed a distinguished career in the military and at Boeing.

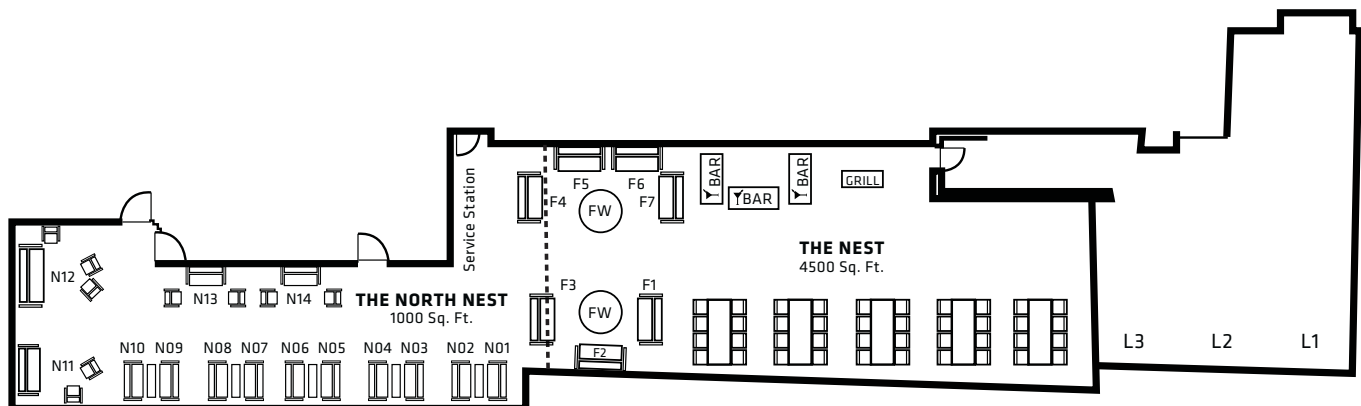
